This residential program provides services to assist young families to build and develop the skills necessary to live successfully and independently in the community. During a stay at the Transitional Living Center, participants receive a variety of services including individual and group counseling, intensive case management, life skills training, job readiness training, educational opportunities, and parenting classes.
